THE FRANKSTON FORESHORE RESERVE

The coast at Frankston extends 9.5km from Keast Park in the north to Kackeraboite Creek in the south. It is part of the traditional lands of the Bunurong people of the Kulin Nation. Today, the Frankston City Council is the management authority on behalf of the Victorian Government

The Foreshore Reserve ranges from long sandy beaches to rocky reefs and weathered cliffs at the iconic Olivers Hill. This high vantage point affords breathtaking views of the bay, distant mountain ranges and the hinterland.

The award-winning beach has significant infrastructure including clubrooms, boat ramps, piers and constructed and naturalistic walkways which support a range of popular active and passive recreational activities and events that attract hundreds of users every year.

The coastal environment supports important flora and fauna habitats, sensitive ecosystems and vegetation of state and local significance with three connecting creeks.

Our practical work sessions at foreshore locations are held every 2nd Tuesday morning in the month from March to October. Your support is invited and needed. Please contact Johan de Bree, Foreshore Activities Coordinator, on 0418 374 981 if you can assist.

- Supplementing coastal vegetation to support the vulnerable dunes against climate-related hazards and other threats;
- Removing environmental weeds, litter and pollutants;
- Protecting and promoting the magnificent landscape values and scenic views and vistas;
- Engaging schools and the community in important conservation and educational works;
- Encouraging the collaborative stewardship of landowners and providing advice and support;
- Monitoring built form and infrastructure proposals for their compatibility with marine and coastal values;
- Securing funding and grants for ongoing and new foreshore projects; and
- Liaising with Members of Parliament, Councillors and Council Officers.
